'Artboards' debuts atop Crossroads bank

February First Fridays marks the debut of Missouri Bank's "Artboards," the inaugural project of the new Art through Architecture (AtA) partnership of American Institute of Architects-Kansas City and the Charlotte Street Foundation.

The boards are mounted above the bank's Crossroads branch at 125 Southwest Blvd. The bank renovated and converted them to hold a changing selection of artworks commissioned from Kansas City artists and produced as digital prints.

The new installation will feature images by Archie Scott Gobber on the east-facing side and images by Miki Baird on the west-facing side.

Gobber's "Changeable" invokes the buzzword of the 2008 presidential election. Baird's "Urban Deposit" is a patterned compilation of photographs of debris she found in the area.
